message from the mayor

Special Census Important for Buckeye's Continued Sustainable Development

"Everyone Counts." To me, the slogan for the City of Buckeye's Special Census that will be conducted this fall actually carries a double meaning.

It is very important for all our residents to be counted in this Special Census, because Buckeye continues to grow... some estimates are that our population has grown some 15 percent since the last national Census in 2010.

If projections hold true, that increase in population, if counted this year, could mean an additional \$7 to \$10 million in state shared revenues over the next five years, until the next U. S. Census in 2020.

Just as importantly, this year's efforts will identify new residents of our neighborhoods that have chosen to make Buckeye their home since 2010. This tally will provide them a sense of pride, officially identifying them as members of this tremendous community.

Census Day 2015 will be celebrated Oct. 1 this year. Unlike the Census in 2000, this resident count will not be done by mailing in forms. On that date, "enumerators," or hired Census workers, will begin going door-to-door throughout the City of Buckeye to collect vital information about the number of residents we now have living in our community.

Buckeye has been recognized nationally as one of the fastest growing cities over the past decade. Our population exploded from 2000 to 2010, growing an incredible 678 percent, according to Census figures.

As a city, we have focused on developing a community that has sound financial footing while offering our residents the programs and services they need and deserve. We take pride in working hard to keep up with the population increases, but it has been difficult. State financial revenues we receive each year remain constant because they are based on the 2010 Census.

State shared revenues help pay for the critical services the city provides, including fire and police protection, street maintenance, parks and libraries. The additional dollars we would receive based on a 15 percent increase in our population will help pay for those vital services.

It's so important you, your family, friends and neighbors take the short time required to acknowledge the Census worker's visit to your home. The questions asked will provide the answers we need to demonstrate that our population has indeed grown significantly.

When a Census worker comes to your door, make sure they have an official identification badge. And be assured that the confidentiality of your responses will be maintained, because each worker must take an oath to protect that confidentiality.

As our great city continues to grow, we will strive to continue moving forward, developing a sustainable community where each and every one of our residents can be proud.

So please, participate in the upcoming special Census here in our community. Everyone Counts! So join me in observing "Census Day 2015" in Buckeye on Oct. 1, and listen for that knock on your door!



Buckeye WestMec Campus Phase 1

As another great asset for Buckeye, the new Buckeye Southwest WestMec campus will provide programs and career training for secondary education; post-secondary education; and industry certifications; in many areas including sustainable energy and industrial technology. Located at I-10 and Verrado Way the campus will eventually serve 650 students in 12 to 14 different programs. Phase I which is scheduled for completion in December includes a 32,000-square-foot, two-story Sustainable Energy building which will include energy programs that have a curriculum focused on electrical, mechanical, instrumentation, and flow loop applications. Phase I also includes a 12,500-square-foot, two-story Student Services Building. At build out, 167,000 square feet of building space will be completed.

Skyline Regional Groundbreaking Ceremony Held - Park to open later this year

The groundbreaking ceremony for Skyline Regional Park was held on June 10th at 9am with 250 people attending to officially recognize the construction of the 8,675 acre park. Buckeye City Council, City management, legislators and representatives, community leaders and elected officials from surrounding cities attended the event. Buckeye Mayor Jackie Meck, Community Services Director Cheryl Sedig and the Bureau of Land Management's Hassayampa Field Office Manager Rem Hawes spoke about the importance of the park and its value for natural, cultural and recreation resources.

Skanska Civil USA West, the contractor responsible for constructing the park is moving quickly, building the access road and installing culverts under the road. Additionally, the City is hiring Okanogan Trail Construction Company to evaluate the trail system and develop a plan to create short, medium and longer duration hikes of varying difficulty levels. They will also prioritize the development of trails and determine those to be constructed in the short-term, medium-term and long-term. Okanogan Trail Construction Company will be responsible for constructing those trails identified as high-priority.

When the park opens later this year, it will feature miles of hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding trails, picnic areas, camping sites, an environmental education programming area and support facilities such as a restroom and gatehouse. Best of all, the park will have no entry fees for day trips.

2nd Public Meeting Parks and Recreation Master Plan

The City of Buckeye is hosting the second public meeting for the Parks and Recreation Master Plan on Tuesday, September 8th at 6pm at Buckeye City Hall. The master plan will provide City officials and the public a vision and framework for an interconnected network of parks, trails and open space influenced by Buckeye's vast natural resources over the next ten years.

During the public meeting, staff will provide an overview of information presented during the first public meeting on March 31, 2015 regarding parks and trails. In addition, plans and policies will be presented regarding open space and cultural and historical resources that should be protected and preserved. Staff will also present information relating to the implementation and funding strategies to ensure plan recommendations are carried out over the next ten years.

Park Locations

Sundance Park

22865 W. Lower Buckeye Road

Thirty acres featuring a dog park for large and small dogs, two lighted youth baseball fields, two lighted softball fields, a lighted football/soccer field, four lighted sand volleyball courts, a .65-mile walking trail, and an incredible playground. There are four picnic ramadas with picnic tables and charcoal grills, drinking fountains throughout, and restroom facilities.

Earl Edgar Recreational Facility

500 S. 1st Street

Two lighted youth baseball fields, two lighted softball fields, one lighted multi-purpose field and one lighted football field. A shaded and boundless playground. Restroom facilities located between the softball, baseball and multi-purpose fields. A half mile lighted walking path. Drinking fountains are centrally located between the baseball and softball fields.

Town Park - 207. N. 9th Street

This 8-acre park is also home to the Aquatic Center and the skate park. The park features, two reservable ramadas with picnic tables and bbq grills, large shaded playground, restrooms and drinking fountains.

6th Street Plaza - 517 E. Monroe Avenue

A shared facility with Buckeye Elementary School features three lighted basketball courts and a lighted event lawn. The basketball courts are available for use from 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. when the school is in session. Non-school days the courts are available from dawn to 10:00 p.m.

Kell Park - 310 N. 6th Street

Kell Park shares the same grounds as the Buckeye Public Library. The one acre park features a shaded playground, half basketball court, and one reservable ramada with picnic tables.

Benbow Veterans Memorial Park

413 E. Monroe Avenue

Located in historic downtown Buckeye this park features shade trees, park benches, engraved pavers and a veterans memorial wall.

Bayless Park - 201 E. Monroe Avenue

This open space park has numerous shade trees and a park bench. The large open turf area is great for play, kite flying, etc. There are no restroom facilities, picnic tables, or drinking fountains.

Ramada Reservations

Reservations are available on-line at www.buckeyeaz.gov/parks or complete a facility use application and return it to the Recreation Center (1003 E. Eason Ave. Buckeye, AZ. 85326). Fees to reserve a ramada are \$10 for a 4-hour block for Buckeye residents and \$20 for non-Buckeye residents. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance.



Athletic Field Reservations

Reservations can be made with our parks division. Fees apply and must be paid prior to an approved reservation. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance. Please note during City of Buckeye youth and adult sport leagues, availability to reserve an athletic field is limited.




