

Message from the Mayor

As we continue into 2016, many good things are happening in our city. While I feel we should always continue looking forward to Buckeye's future, it's also good sometimes to look back at some of the good things that we've accomplished.

This past summer, the city purchased the assets of the Global Water Co. to not only provide water to the nearly 7,000 additional customers but also enhance the city's already high water quality standards. And we are using money from a \$28 million bond sale voters approved to deliver water and wastewater infrastructure to areas of the city identified as prime locations for future business and industrial development.

One of the most significant additions to our community is the beautiful new Skyline Regional Park in the southern White Tank Mountains. This serene place in nature includes walking and hiking trails, interior park roads, a gatehouse entry station, picnic ramadas, camping sites and restroom facilities. It is definitely a place you and your family should visit.

We've just recently celebrated the first anniversary of the Coyote Branch of the Buckeye Public Library System, a state-of-the-art facility that offers residents their own windows to the world. Not to be outdone, the Downtown Branch of the library system, which for decades has anchored the city's cultural amenities, is being given a facelift as well.

The new WEST-MEC's campus on the grounds of the APS Energy Education Center is now open. The sustainable energy building will include programs that will provide students from Buckeye and the rest of the Valley the training they need for quality employment in a variety of private and public sectors. In addition, we also continue the critical partnerships with Estrella Mountain Community College and Grand Canyon University which offer courses at their campuses in the Buckeye Union High School.

We have seen many exciting things happen in Buckeye in the past year. It reminds me of someone once saying that the greatest pleasure in life is doing what people say you can't do. But we're not satisfied with what has been done so far. This city is headed full force into the 21st century. Buckeye's future lies before us.

Our Marketing and Communications team is out front of a new messaging campaign for the city – "Welcome to Arizona's biggest opportunity." From a new logo to a redesigned city web site, from a new economic development web site to a 32-page electronic booklet that reveals interesting perspective on the city's history and drive – the campaign is designed to bolster Buckeye's image, to attract business, industry and a new residential base.

Buckeye is a thriving community that boasts something old – its rich agricultural past – with a strategic planning effort focused sharply on sustainable economic and community development. The message stresses that Buckeye offers a blank canvas and that it is truly one of the few remaining Arizona cities where opportunity can be seen in every direction and from virtually every vantage point.

I ask you to join me, members of the city council, our tremendous city staff and your friends and neighbors across our 600 square miles in working together to attain the successes that will catapult Buckeye to its deserved spot as a leading community in Maricopa County.







Where does Buckeye's water come from?

PRECIPITATION



Rain and snow creates our water supply.
Runoff naturally recharges back in the ground.

There is **NO** new water! Buckeye depends **100% on groundwater**. Most other cities have rivers or CAP water to tap into, which gives them other options when it comes to water supply. **Groundwater is the same water supply we have had since the dinosaurs roamed the earth**, so it really is our most precious resource.

Buckeye has regulations that say for every gallon of water we take out of the ground, we have to put a gallon back in. We do this through our wastewater treatment facilities.

So unlike other cities, we have significantly more work to treat our water, clean our water and deliver our water to residents. Hopefully this flow chart will help explain some of the costs of getting water to and from your home, as well show how important it is to conserve our only water supply for the future.

IT BEGINS HERE

EFFLUENT WATER USES

Buckeye uses effluent water in our parks and fields



RECHARGE

Reclaimed water is stored in a aquifer. Aquifers are geological formations which absorb water like a giant sponge. Some water is recovered for drinking supply.

WATER TREATMENT

Well water is pumped out of the ground and disinfected.

Water undergoes multiple purification steps.



WATER RECLAMATION

Used water undergoes multiple purification steps at treatment plants.



SAFE TO DRINK

Water quality is verified as safe to drink.



Used water is collected and transported for treatment.

WATER LEAVES YOUR HOME

Be mindful of what goes down the drain as it will end up in your water. Make sure you are not flushing hazardous waste like paint or oil and do not flush old pills or prescriptions.

Safe water is delivered by pumps, storage and piped directly to your home.

REFUND POLICY: It is the City of Buckeye – Recreation Division policy that no refunds will be issued after the start of the course. All refunds must be requested 4 business days prior to the start of the course. A \$2 processing fee will added to each refund request.

(1:6 ratio) This class is conducted in deep water. Your child is ready for the class if he/she is able to:

 - Back float for 3 sec without assistance
 - Push off the wall and front streamline kick to the instructor for 5 yards.
- SWIM DIAPERS REQUIRED**

SCHOOL AGE LESSONS

Level 1 (5 - 12 yrs)

(1:5 ratio) Children are required to put their face in the water. Your child is ready for the class if he/she is able to:

- Comfortable in the water
- Listen and follow simple instruction

Level 2 (5 - 12 yrs)

(1:5 ratio) Your child is ready for the class if he/she is able to:

- Enter the water independently
- Jump off the side into shoulder deep water
- Back float for 3 sec with assistance
- Front streamline kicking off the wall for 5 yards

Level 3 (5 - 12 yrs)

(1:6 ratio) This class is conducted in deep water. Your child is ready for the class if he/she is able to:

- Front float for 3 sec and then roll onto back float without assistance for 3 sec
- Swim 10 yards backstroke
- Swim 10 yards freestyle

Level 4 (5 - 12 yrs)

(1:6 ratio) This class is conducted in deep water. Your child is ready for the class if he/she is able to:

- Jump into deep water from wall, recover and swim back to edge of the pool
- Maintain position by floating for 30 sec
- Freestyle for 25 yards (length of pool)
- Backstroke for 25 yards (length of pool)
- Swim 10 yards breaststroke kick

SPECIALTY LESSONS

Swim Team Prep (8 - 17 yrs)

(1:10 ratio) This class is designed to teach participants how to further coordinate and refine proper competitive swim strokes. Strokes will include freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke and butterfly.

Learn to Dive (8 - 17 yrs)

(1:8 ratio) Diving class will focus on the basic diving skills, diving safety, proper techniques, flexibility and fun. This class is geared towards the beginner diver who has had little to no instruction. 
