message from the mayor

One of the things I like best about a growing and vibrant Buckeye is that new and great things are always happening. Just in the last couple of months alone, we've had three new restaurants – Jimmy John's, Wing Stop and Culver's, all opening their doors and serving their specific menus of great food to our residents and visitors.

The Buckeye Police Department's new substation in the Sundance Crossings Center opened and, in the next few months, we'll see a new Fire Station in Festival Ranch. Those two events bring a heightened public safety presence closer to some of our neighborhoods.

A couple of trails at Skyline Regional Park have been extended, and in the next month or so you'll see additional trails opened, bringing the total in exciting hiking opportunities to 17 miles of trails in our beautiful natural recreation amenity.

Talk about new and exciting – soon you'll see construction taking off at the site of Buckeye's first manufacturing facility in more than two decades when work starts on the new Buckeye home of Cardinal IG Company. The 200,000 square-foot residential glass manufacturing plant just west of the Wal-Mart Distribution Center will bring more than 100 jobs to Buckeye in the next year.

As I have said for years now, "Buckeye is Open for Business."

And while it's always great to see new things happening in our city, there are the traditional things that happen here as we move from summer into fall that we hold close.

Like the cooling summer swim days that families can enjoy together at the Buckeye Aquatic Center (Be safe around water!). Like a visit to the Buckeye Valley Museum when it opens again in September, giving your family and relatives a glimpse back to our founders' heritage.

Now is a great time to start thinking about training for your entry into one of the many events slated for the 3rd annual Buckeye Marathon, which includes the marathon run that is a qualifier for the famous Boston Marathon, as well as your choice of other distances – the half marathon, 10K, 5K and one mile fun run.

For all the winter visitors making their way back to their homes here in Buckeye, Welcome Back! And to our young adults traveling near and far to start their new careers, whether it be college, technical school or a full-time job, I wish you the best of luck.

Always remember that Buckeye – even as it changes for the better every day – will always be your home.

Park Locations

Sundance Park - 22865 W. Lower Buckeye Rd.

30-acres featuring a dog park for large and small dogs, two lighted youth baseball fields, two lighted softball fields, a lighted football/soccer field, four lighted sand volleyball courts, a .65-mile walking trail, and an incredible playground. There are four picnic ramadas with picnic tables and charcoal grills, drinking fountains throughout, and restroom facilities.

Earl Edgar - 500 S. 1st Street

Two lighted youth baseball fields, two lighted softball fields, one lighted multi-purpose field and one lighted football field. A shaded and boundless playground. Restroom facilities located between the softball, baseball and multi-purpose fields. A half mile lighted walking path. Drinking fountains are centrally located between the baseball and softball fields.

Town Park - 207. N. 9th Street

This 8-acre park is also home to the Aquatic Center and the skate park. The park features two reservable ramadas with picnic tables and bbq grills, large shaded playground, restrooms and drinking fountains.

6th Street Plaza - 517 E. Monroe Avenue

A shared facility with Buckeye Elementary School features three lighted basketball courts and a lighted event lawn. The basketball courts are available for use from 4:00 pm to 10:00 pm when the school is in session. Non-school days the courts are available from dawn to 10:00 pm.

Kell Park - 310 N. 6th Street

Kell Park shares the same grounds as the Buckeye Public Library Downtown. The one acre park features a shaded playground, half basketball court, and one reservable ramada with picnic tables.

Benbow Veterans Memorial Park

413 E. Monroe Avenue

Located in historic downtown Buckeye this park features shade trees, park benches, engraved pavers and a veterans memorial wall.

Bayless Park - 201 E. Monroe Avenue

This open space park has numerous shade trees and a park bench. The large open turf area is great for play, kite flying, etc. There are no restroom facilities, picnic tables, or drinking fountains.

Ramada Reservations

Reservations are available on-line at www.buckeyeaz.gov/parks or complete a facility use application and return it to the Recreation Center (1003 E. Eason Ave. Buckeye, AZ 85326). Fees to reserve a ramada are \$10 for a 4-hour block for Buckeye residents and \$20 for non-Buckeye residents. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance.

Athletic Field Reservations

Reservations can be made with our Parks Division. Fees apply and must be paid prior to an approved reservation. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance. Please note during City of Buckeye youth and adult sport leagues, availability to reserve an athletic field is limited.







2016 BULK TRASH PICK-UP

Set your bulk pile out for collection **on your property**, parallel to the street or curb, before 5 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection.


The bulk pile must **not be larger than 6' x 6' x 6'** – You are responsible for disposal of bulk waste over this amount. Your pile shall not be placed on the sidewalk, in the street, behind a fence or any obstruction. Items must be placed in bundles – 3' long stacked and tied piles.

If you live within incorporated city limits, you **MUST** have a solid waste account with the City.

BULK TRASH CREWS

DO NOT PICK UP:

- Household Hazardous Waste (paint, chemicals, oil, batteries)
- Appliances containing Freon
- Infectious or medical solid waste, sharps (needles), and medicine
- Metal material or automobile parts over fifty (50) pounds
- Tires from any type of vehicle (take these to the county landfill)
- Glass (windows, patio doors, etc.)
- Bricks, concrete, dirt, rocks, asphalt, roofing or similar materials
- Whole or un-bundled bushes or trees
- Anything more than the allowed 6X6X6 area

Just one year ago, summer was approaching for Oscar Denogean and his dreams of maybe a trip out of state, some kind of fun.

Hold on. His mother, Olivia, had different thoughts for her 17-year-old son, the oldest of her 14 children.

“My mom told me I had to do something, get a job or apply for that summer school,” Oscar recalled.

“That” summer school was the Buckeye Public Library System’s Youth Entrepreneurship Outreach Network two-week free summer Youth Academy (there still are openings for this year’s academy July 11-22).



Today, Oscar M. Denogean is poised like a rocket a foot off launch pad Buckeye, ready to explode not only into his senior year at Odyssey Institute for Advanced and

International Studies, a Buckeye charter high school. But into a career he sees filled with business opportunities – not to further himself financially like many young entrepreneurs, but to help the poor, disadvantaged and homeless.

Starting this fall, while in his senior year at Odyssey, Oscar will also be attending Western Maricopa Technical Education Center in Buckeye from 4 to 6:30 p.m. on school nights, taking energy and industrial technology courses.

And yes, college is in his future. “My parents would kill me if I didn’t,” he half-joked.

In the past 12 months, Oscar has not only attended high school classes and volunteered at the Buckeye Public Library and with his family at All Faith Community Services but has also

- Excelled at that Youth Academy – his team’s proposal for a business took first place honors and seed money to start the bi-lingual board game “Huh.” Oscar sees a strong potential market for the game in educational systems
- Earned a spot on the Buckeye Youth Council which meets monthly to learn about the City of Buckeye and advise the Buckeye City Council on issues concerning youth in the city.
- Was selected to attend the prestigious W.P. Carey School of Business Summer Program for Youth at Arizona State University in July
- Applied for the Governor’s Youth Commission (“I check my emails a lot every day to see if I’ve made the cut”)
- Attended classes regularly in the library’s extensive Entrepreneurship Outreach Network (EON) that provides weekly networking and learning opportunities with other business owners in the area (“We can learn from other people on the right way to do things”).

Lynda Bishop, the leader of the youth academy, earned the trust of the young entrepreneur during last year's academy. At one point, he confided in her with his "great idea" for a business.

"It was a great idea, and what impressed me most wasn't the idea itself, but his WHY," Bishop said. "Oscar wants to make a difference. He is passionate and driven to help others."

Another adult in Oscar's life this past year has been Janene Van Leeuwen, education outreach coordinator who heads up the Buckeye Public Library system's Youth EON.

While Oscar says it was the Youth Academy that gave him the confidence and the business savvy to pursue two upstart business ventures, it appears that his parents provided the "morals, culture and family values" that have helped form this burgeoning young entrepreneur, his mother says.

"Because he is our oldest, we expected more from Oscar, and while it's been hard, he's validating that I've done a good job raising him," she said proudly. "Oscar is very ambitious and very generous, and he has set the bar high for the rest of my children.

"I have watched him grow as a student and mature as an entrepreneur and a young leader in Buckeye," she said.



A new 200,000 square foot high-tech glass manufacturing facility with over 100 employees will soon be calling Buckeye home! Cardinal IG Company has committed to purchasing land and building near Apache and Maricopa Roads. As part of the expansion and development agreements approved by Mayor and Council on June 7, the City will be making improvements to Apache Road as well as purchasing approximately 10 acres for a needed regional water campus in this area from Cardinal IG. According to Mayor Meck, "By controlling key water infrastructure in strategically located areas of central Buckeye, elected officials, city staff, and key stakeholders were able to bring this great opportunity to Buckeye." 
