



# economic development

## Buckeye is Home of the Largest Land Sale in the Region in over 10 Years

On September 1, 2016, three investment groups purchased the remaining land and assets of the Tartesso Master Planned Community in Buckeye. The Community, the third largest master planned community in Buckeye encompasses roughly 10,000 acres and will eventually be home to over 120,000 residents. Tartesso is located on both sides of the Sun Valley Parkway approximately 4 miles north of Interstate 10. As of 2008, there were nearly 1,000 homes located there and with ultimate build out of 40,000 homes.



DR Horton is underway with new models in the community that will eventually have retail and commercial components as Tartesso develops. This sale is further evidence that Buckeye has bounced back from the great recession and is moving forward as one of the most desirable communities in nation.

The City continues to aggressively pursue industrial, commercial, and retail projects. Given the recent successes, velocity of interest, population growth, tourism and recreational opportunities as well as strong elected leadership, we are coordinating outreach to specific constituencies. We accomplish this through traditional targeted advertising, social media, one-on-one interactions, and through strategic partnerships throughout the U.S. and region. A couple of recent examples include our false cover featured in the August edition of *Western Real Estate Business*, as well as the August Edition of *Expansion Solutions*.

Through August of 2016, the City of Buckeye has issued 966 housing permits, up 27% during the same period last year. In fact, June and August saw 166 and 164 permits per month respectively which are at levels not seen since 2008. The two most active communities by permits issued are Verrado and Festival Ranch, while many communities South of I-10 continue to gain momentum as well.



## Construction To Begin For Cardinal IG Manufacturing Facility

Over the coming months, residents will see significant construction activity at the future home of Cardinal IG's newest manufacturing facility in Buckeye. The site is located west of the Wal-Mart Distribution Center near Apache and Alta Vista Roads. The 250,000 square foot facility will feature advanced manufacturing equipment to produce insulated glass to some of the world's largest window manufacturers. This is the first phase of the project which will grow as demand warrants.

# DEC. 10 2016 **BUCKEYE MARATHON** THIRD ANNUAL

**T**he handful of events during the Dec. 10 Buckeye Marathon will test the runners chasing their personal best times to the finish line at the Buckeye Municipal Airport.

But there will be a different kind of challenge on the airport grounds that day, this one designed to test the physical fitness of youngsters, teens, young adults – entire families – a CrossFit Fury obstacle course.

Buckeye Recreation Manager Miranda Gomez said the obstacle course will provide a different kind of draw – a challenge that more people can have fun doing while testing their own physical fitness.

“The marathon event was started three years ago as part of the city’s goal of focusing on developing healthy lifestyles for our residents, and this obstacle course will provide many more residents an opportunity to test their conditioning in a fun setting,” Gomez said.

Gomez said that Peter Egyed, the owner of CrossFit Fury in Goodyear, has agreed to construct the obstacle course, which will be situated on the airport grounds not far from the marathon’s finish line.

“The one-mile obstacle course will test balance, coordination and agility, as well as stamina and cardio-respiratory endurance,” Egyed said. “You will see footwork drills like a tire field, balance beams and a rope zig-zag course, while mixing in the strength components such as wall climbs, hay bale obstacles and a Styrofoam mountain.”

Meanwhile, registration remains open for all events at the Dec. 10 marathon.

## Obstacle Course Will Test Youth of All Ages

Last year, more than 900 participants from 28 states, Canada, Australia and from around the Valley crossed the finish line at the Buckeye Municipal Airport, one mile south of Interstate 10 on Palo Verde Road.

The full marathon course has again been certified by USA Track & Field as an official marathon distance and a qualifier for the world-famous Boston Marathon and other national marathons.

The marathon will actually begin well north of the airport in the Festival Ranch neighborhood. The half marathon, 10K, 5K and one-mile fun run will all start and end at the Buckeye Municipal Airport.

All runners will be chip timed by Start-Line Racing. Awards will be given to the top three finishers in all age categories (five-year age groups).







Two lighted youth baseball fields, two lighted softball fields, one lighted multi-purpose field and one lighted football field. A shaded and boundless playground. Restroom facilities located between the softball, baseball and multi-purpose fields. A half mile lighted walking path. Drinking fountains are centrally located between the baseball and softball fields.

#### Town Park - 207. N. 9th Street

This 8-acre park is also home to the Aquatic Center and the skate park. The park features two reservable ramadas with picnic tables and bbq grills, large shaded playground, restrooms and drinking fountains.

#### 6th Street Plaza - 517 E. Monroe Avenue

A shared facility with Buckeye Elementary School features three lighted basketball courts and a lighted event lawn. The basketball courts are available for use from 4:00 pm to 10:00 pm when the school is in session. Non-school days the courts are available from dawn to 10:00 pm.

#### Kell Park - 310 N. 6th Street

Kell Park shares the same grounds as the Buckeye Public Library Downtown. The one acre park features a shaded playground, half basketball court, and one reservable ramada with picnic tables.

#### Benbow Veterans Memorial Park

##### 413 E. Monroe Avenue

Located in historic downtown Buckeye this park features shade trees, park benches, engraved pavers and a veterans memorial wall.

#### Bayless Park - 201 E. Monroe Avenue

This open space park has numerous shade trees and a park bench. The large open turf area is great for play, kite flying, etc. There are no restroom facilities, picnic tables, or drinking fountains.

### Ramada Reservations

Reservations are available online at [www.buckeyeaz.gov/parks](http://www.buckeyeaz.gov/parks) or complete a facility use application and return it to the Recreation Center (1003 E. Eason Ave. Buckeye, AZ 85326). Fees to reserve a ramada are \$10 for a 4-hour block for Buckeye residents and \$20 for non-Buckeye residents. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance.

### Athletic Field Reservations

Reservations can be made with our Parks Division. Fees apply and must be paid prior to an approved reservation. All reservations must be made 72 hours in advance. Please note during City of Buckeye youth and adult sport leagues, availability to reserve an athletic field is limited.

## park code updates

On September 6th, Buckeye City Council adopted an update to Chapter 11 of City Code, which includes rules and regulations for use of City parks. Chapter 11 was last adopted in 2009 and an update was needed to address current issues and to add policies relating to Skyline Regional Park, which opened in January 2016.

The new regulations go into effect October 6, 2016 and include the following:

- Beer can be consumed at park ramadas and campsites with a paid permit in conjunction with a ramada or campsite reservation.
- Inflatables and bounce houses require a permit in association with a ramada reservation (no inflatables and bounce houses at Skyline Regional Park).
- Shade canopies may be used for spectator viewing during City sports programs and events; however

they must be weighted and not staked into the ground to ensure they are not overturned by wind.

- The new regulations prohibit feeding or disturbing wildlife in City parks.
- The public must stay on designated and posted trail routes and must comply with all rules and regulations posted on kiosks, markers and signs.
