With a New Year underway, I always try to take a few minutes to focus on our past successes to ensure the coming year continues providing you with the best quality of life in our great city.

Back in May, Buckeye was named the fastest growing city in the country by the U.S. Census Bureau. So, more and more people are discovering what you already know, Buckeye is a great place to live, work and raise a family.

Our Economic Development staff continues to bring new services and amenities to you.

The new Home 2 hotel by Hilton, just north of Yuma on Watson, is scheduled to open in January. Dutch Bros., Café Rio and My Place hotel are all currently under construction in this same area and should be open in a few short months. In addition, new medical offices and buildings near Sundance Parkway are underway as well.

In Verrado, Marriott announced a new hotel behind Culvers, and Kroger is now moving forward with the Fry's at Indian School and Jackrabbit. Kroger expects this store to be open by the end of the year.

Buckeye's Community Services staff continues to provide the best family friendly events for you to enjoy. The Buckeye Marathon, which attracts nearly 1,000 runners annually to the Buckeye Airport, has moved to the first weekend in January. This new date should attract additional participants who are trying to qualify for the Boston Marathon.


We're partnering again with Copperstate Fly-In to bring you a bigger and better 2020 Buckeye Air Fair Feb. 7 through 9. You can expect more aircraft displays this year and additional stunt pilots for the live, two-hour air show on Saturday and Sunday. There's also a Kid's Zone, great food and fun vendors to explore.

On Saturday at the Air Fair, the Sci-Tech Fest provides hands-on activities to explore and learn about the world of aviation.

From the Director

Happy New Year from all of us at the City of Buckeye Community Services Department! Spring is just around the corner and it is a great time to get outside and enjoy your City Parks or even hit the trails at Skyline Regional Park!

In each issue of the Eye on Buckeye, I will be sharing some fun facts about the Community Services Department beginning with Skyline Regional Park.

The idea of Skyline Regional Park began in 2002 with Buckeye City Council's approval to submit an application to the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to preserve open space for future generations. In 2010, the City of Buckeye entered into a 25 year, no cost lease with BLM. Construction of the park began in June 2015.

Skyline Regional Park opened in January 2016 with 5.5 miles of trails and a 15-acre trailhead and over the years more trails were added. In January 2018, Mayor Jackie Meck and City Council members officially opened Red-Tailed Hawk Accessible Trail so everyone, regardless of their ability, is able to enjoy the park and its natural resources. Pyrite Trail opened later that year bringing the total to 22 miles of trails of varying difficulty. Skyline Regional Park has the capacity to accommodate 55 miles of trails primarily in northern sections of the park and could eventually connect to Maricopa County's White Tank Mountain Regional Park. We have one full-time and one half-time staff who clean and stock restrooms, post ramada and campsite reservations, pick-up trash, maintain trails and haul over 130,000 gallons of water annually to Skyline. Did you know the parks staff hike over 275 miles a year just maintaining the trails? This is the equivalent of hiking from Phoenix to Las Vegas!

Skyline Regional Park has become a local point of pride for residents as seen by the positive online reviews and a consistent increase in visitation. Park visitation grew by 62% over a three-year period, from an estimated 189,000 visitors in 2016 in its first year of operation to 307,000 estimated visitors in 2018. Camping reservations for the 7 sites increased by 99% during the last three-year period. Participation in our interpretive and educational programs and events also increased by 8% during the last two-years.

Additional parking and sustainable operations continue to be a focus of future planning efforts to ensure we are meeting visitors' needs while safeguarding the long-term preservation of the park's natural resources.
